The Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees was called to order at 6:30 p.m. in the Township Board Chambers, Clinton Township Civic Center. Also in attendance was Mr. Jack Dolan, Township Attorney. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

1. RESOLUTION TO COMMEMORATE THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF OTTAWA ELEMENTARY

Mr. Gieleghem explained this is a resolution for one of the elementary schools in the Chippewa Valley School District.

Mike Sheridan, Chairman of Macomb Food Program, explained that this is the 26th annual food drive which approximately 10,000 cities in American participate. The letter carriers will pick up donations from homes. Last year they collected 350,000 pounds of food in this one day and 80 million pounds were collected nationwide. If you would like to volunteer you could show up at one of the post offices and they will be happy to have you. This event is always the second Saturday in May. He mentioned that last year, 2.7 million pounds of food were delivered last year in Macomb County. He thanked Kroger for their donation of plastic bags.

Mr. Smith, Human Resources Director, explained the current system "crashed". Their cost for the old system was approximately \$19,000 a year. The cost for the first year includes installation of the new system. Our system is complex and not all software can give us the functionality we need. The new proposed software was the best fit. Some of our current information is missing and we would have to input that but the rest should download from the old system.

Mr. Keys asked if there was a contract and asked that it be forwarded to the Trustees. He also thanked him for getting the NARCAN training in place.

22. DISCUSSION REGARDING ENGINEER SERVICES

Mrs. Meltzer feels this is a good idea given we have projects that are not finished.

Mr. Gielegghem said that we have been with our engineering firm since 2010. The person assigned to our contract has moved on. He understands that we are

heading into construction season and that we would like to maintain continuity. We have an open ended contract with our current firm so we are not in violation by bringing on another firm. He is satisfied with this compromise. He also does not want or feel the need to begin the bid process heading into construction season. He would, however, like to set a date that we would start the bid process. He agrees with getting through construction season but this request puts us to the end of this fiscal year.

Mr. Pearl reminded the Board that when this was bid, these firms were 1 and 2. He is familiar with both firms and is satisfied with both. At one point the Board hired AEW to double check figures on a project.

Mr. Cannon does not want to put a date on when we will go to bid. Depending on each project, our in house engineer will determine the appropriate company. It is not currently beneficial to bid during construction season.

Motion by Mr. Pearl, supported by Mrs. Meltzer, to receive and file the letter dated April 26, 2018 from the Township Supervisor, and approve the use of two Consulting firms, Giffels Webster and Anderson, Eckstein and Westrick (AEW), on an as needed basis for the remainder of this fiscal year. 25. RESOLUTION APPROVING BALLOT LANGUAGE POLICE MILLAGE AND DIRECTING THE CLERK REGARDING THE PRIMARY ELECTION DATE AUGUST 7, 2018

Mr. Dolan stated that previously the Board unanimously voted to move forward with a millage renewal. This is the actual language and resolution that will go to

the County Clerk's office for placement on the August Primary ballot. He and the Assistant Finance Director have reviewed and approved the language.

The proposal is to establish the millage extension for a 6 year period at a rate of 0.9875 mills.

Motion by Mr. Pearl, supported by Mr. Gielegghem, to adopt the resolution approving ballot language Police Millage and directing the Clerk regarding the Primary Election date August 7, 2018, as presented. 26. RESOLUTION APPROVING BALLOT LANGUAGE FIRE MILLAGE AND DIRECTING THE CLERK REGARDING THE PRIMARY ELECTION DATE AUGUST 7, 2018

Mr. Dolan said this extension is for a period of 8 years to 2029. It was last voted on in 2002 and the second millage was voted on in 2013. Both are affected by Headlee Rollback.

Mr. Gielegghem noted that the 2 current millages are being combined and this is not an increase but a renewal and reduction of both millages.

Motion by Mrs. Meltzer, supported by Mr. Gielegghem, to adopt the resolution approving ballot language Fire Millage and directing the Clerk regarding the Primary Election date August 7, 2018, as presented. Roll Call: Ayes – Meltzer, Gielegghem, West, Keys, Pearl, Cannon, Aragona. Nays – None. Absent – None. Motion carried.

27. RESOLUTION APPROVING BALLOT LANGUAGE ROAD MILLAGE AND DIRECTING THE CLERK REGARDING THE PRIMARY ELECTION DATE AUGUST 7, 2018

Mr. Dolan said this resolution is based on what the Road Committee recommended regarding the condition of roads and road funding which was approved by the Board. This executes the Board's decision to proceed. We are proposing 1.9 mills for 5 years from 2018-2022 to replace and repair roads. The ballot language also addresses curbs, storm drainage and driveways.

Motion by Mrs. West, supported by Mr. Cannon, to adopt the resolution approving ballot language Road Millage and directing the Clerk regarding the Primary Election date August 7, 2018, as presented. Discussion ensued.

Mr. Gielegghem pointed out that the language doesn't mention the roads we are going to improve. He asked if we have to work in conjunction with the Macomb County Department of Road.

Mr. Dolan replied affirmatively.

Mr. Gieleghem said he will be voting against this because he is unable to tell the residents what they will be getting with this millage. This is not a renewal, it is a new tax. We, and residents, do not have any control on which roads will be fixed. The County will be borrowing \$20 million from the delinquent tax revolving fund. Any money they receive in the future will go toward paying this debt back. We have not had any public hearings regarding this matter. He is also concerned that we are putting essential service proposals, along with a number of other proposals, on the August ballot. They may fail because people are struggling with their own finances and may not be able to afford a new tax.

Mrs. West withdrew her motion.

Mr. Pearl said that everyone is entitled to their opinion. He has seen work being done in other communities. We can't get money out of the State. We have needs in this area and need to give the citizens an opportunity to make their decision with a vote. There are Township funds we have taken from to support road repair.

Mrs. West said there is no doubt the roads are awful. She does think we need to educate the public about what is on the ballot and where the funds are going.

Mr. Keys has a concern regarding the education of the public. They want a plan and explanation as to what this millage will cover.

Mr. Rodney Tolbert, 43600 Naves, spoke with his neighbors and they all want to know what roads are going to be fixed and where their money will be going. They do want the roads fixed but feels they would vote "no" without this information.

Mr. Cannon stressed that the money would all be for Clinton Township roads. He said that all of the Township roads are being analyzed. He doesn't feel the legislature will be able to get any action due to there not being any funds available at the State level.

Mr. Gieleghem said that a majority of the legislators do not want to impose new taxes and are putting the problems on the back of the local communities.

Mrs. Meltzer asked if Mr. Cannon could clarify the roads being proposed to be fixed. This vote will be an opportunity for the public to weigh in. She did speak with legislature and was told they will be addressing Public Act 51. There are factions within the State of Michigan to take into consideration and it is incumbent

to all of us to reach out to our senators to discuss our needs. This is a tenuous issue which needs to be funded.

Mr. Pearl understands that there is no money coming for roads. Currently we repair 4 streets a year that County participates in with a split. This millage would replace their position when they run out of funds. He agrees that we need give the residents more education.

Motion by Mr. Pearl, supported by Mr. Cannon, to adopt the resolution approving ballot language Road Millage and directing the Clerk regarding the Primary Election date August 7, 2018, as presented.
